



Concurrent or Dual Enrollment

You may attend classes at A&M- Commerce and another institution at the same time. This is referred to as concurrent or dual enrollment. International students may take classes at two universities but the total enrollment at both schools must meet the USCIS requirements for a full course of study unless you have permission from an international advisor from the ISSO. A&M-Commerce policy requires our university to have your SEVIS immigration record if the majority of the courses (credit hours) you are enrolled in are at A&M-Commerce. There are limitations on online/web courses and the majority of your classes (credit hours) must be\ at A&M-Commerce. There are some exceptions for the summer semester.
